

INFORMATION FOR STOCKFEED MANUFACTURERS

Enclosed is your Permit to manufacture Stockfeed. Your permit is issued subject to the requirements set out in the *Poisons Act 1964* and *Poisons Regulations 1965*. Please read the conditions on your permit and note the following:

- Upon receipt of this permit you should forward a copy of the permit to your Schedule 4 wholesale supplier.
- Stockfeed containing Schedule 4 substances such as antibiotics may only be prepared and supplied on receipt of a valid order from the customer. This order must be written and signed by a veterinary surgeon registered in Western Australia. The stockfeed is to be manufactured in accordance with this signed order and the quantity prepared must be as specified on the signed order. The prepared stockfeed may only be supplied to the person specified on the signed order.
- The signed order must be retained by the Stockfeed Manufacturer for two years and must be available for inspection when requested.
- Only those Schedule 4 poisons which are listed on your permit may be purchased and mixed into the stockfeed in accordance with a written order from a veterinary surgeon.
- This permit does not allow for the sale of Schedule 4 poisons in stockfeed pre-mixes.
- All Schedule 4 poisons must be stored in a locked cupboard at a temperature in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendation.
- Advice regarding serious spillage of any poison may be obtained by telephoning the Department of Environment and Conservation– Emergency Pollution Response Unit on 1300 784 782 or after hours 1800 018 800.

Changes to the Poisons Permit

This Permit has been issued in your name on behalf of a business or company and at a specified site. Any proposed change to the details on your permit should be forwarded to the Department for the permit to remain valid. If you cease employment with the business for which you hold this permit you must notify the Department of Health in writing. If the business changes ownership an application for a Poisons Permit should be submitted by the new owners of the business.

The granting of a permit to a new business and/or new permit holder is not automatic and assessment of relevant experience and qualifications is taken into account.
