To successfully submit an application for renewal of Petroleum Exploration Permit, the application must be made in the approved manner, which includes completion of this form, be accompanied by the prescribed fee, and must include submission of detailed attachments providing the information specified below. The application is required to be submitted three months prior to the expiry of the current permit term. Attention is drawn to the provisions of Sections 41 and 42(A) of the Act and any transitional provisions that may apply.

1. The business address for each permittee company and percentage participating interest for each permittee to the application. The name of the designated permittee/operator should also be included.
2. The minimum work program proposed for each of the five years of the renewal term and should not contain any contingency work. The details should include the specific number of wells to be drilled, the line or square kilometres of seismic surveys to be carried out, and the estimated expenditure in Australian dollars. The details should be expressed in the following example terms: 100km New 2D Seismic Survey.
3. The technical qualifications of the permittee and of its employees evidencing the applicant's ability to undertake the proposed work.
4. A plan and listing of the 1:1,000,000 map sheet block numbers to which the renewal application applies and a further plan and listing of the block numbers to be relinquished. Any current Location blocks should be identified.
5. The full details of the hydrocarbon potential of the area, including a geological review and an outline of the exploration philosophy of the permittee.
6. Such other information as the permittee wishes to be taken into account on consideration of its application.
7. The prescribed fee, stated in the Schedule of Fees (available at www.dmp.wa.gov.au/10470.aspx), is to be made **payable to the Department of Mines and Petroleum** through an Australian Bank or by Australian bank cheque and must be submitted with the application. Fees are non-refundable and subject to variation (including Consumer Price Index adjustments) and the current Schedule of Fees must be consulted prior to payment.

Note:

1. Upon successful grant of the renewal, the title holder(s) will be required to fulfil the minimum commitment for the first two years without variation. This is known as the firm commitment phase. The balance of the program may be re-negotiated based on or taking into consideration the results of prior exploration.
2. The title holder's obligation to give consideration to other resource interests, such as geothermal, fishing, mining, and other land uses would continue under any title renewal.
