

Explanatory Notes for the Completion of an Application for Permit to Light Fire

LEGEND
 Information required to be provided under s 65 of the Fire and Rescue Service Act, 1990 or, by s 38 of the Fire and Rescue Service Regulation 2001.

* Complete and accurate contact details are required to clearly identify you as the permit applicant and enable contact in the case of fire emergencies, increased fire danger or to notify of local fire bans.

* Required to clearly identify the property on which the intended fire is to be lit.

This information will help the Fire Warden determine if your fire management practices are sufficient for the job.

A "capable" person is one who is physically and mentally capable of combating the fire and close enough to take immediate action

I provide the following in relation to the planned fire:
 » I request a Permit to Light Fire be issued for the following period: 11.1.07.1.11. to 25.07.1.11 (e.g. hazard reduction, debris removal, weed control, pasture management, other e.g., social bonfire)
 » Purpose of the fire: Remove clearing rubbish
 » Material to be burnt: 2 x stacks of pulled scrub bark+2 each (e.g. stack forest, grass, crop residue, woodchip, sawdust, etc)
 » Total area to be burnt: 2x40x2 stacks in square metres or hectares. Eg. if a stack - 4m long x 3 m wide x 2 m high, if bush or grass - 5,000 sq m or .5 Ha
 I have taken (will take) the following precautions to prevent the spread of the fire:
 » Constructed a firebreak consisting of: hove earth around each stack (type) and to a width of: 3m (metres)
 » Will have the following tools / equipment on site to prevent the spread of, or to extinguish the fire: 4x4 with 600L mop up unit, tractor with back blade
 » Will have 2 capable persons available on site to prevent the spread of fire from the area to be burned (minimum of 2 persons).
 » I have notified, or made reasonable attempts to notify, all adjoining owners / occupiers of my intention to apply for a Permit to Light Fire, at least 72 hours prior to submitting this application.

* Reasonable attempts must be made to notify adjoining owners/occupiers of your intention to apply for a fire permit. Additionally, those owners/occupiers must have a reasonable opportunity to raise any concerns that they have regarding the proposed fire, to the Fire Warden. 72 hours has been determined as a reasonable amount of time to notify your neighbours and give them an opportunity to raise any concerns with the Fire Warden.
 See the Notes on the back of the Application for a definition of "adjoining".

FILLING IN THE REVERSE SIDE OF THE APPLICATION

There are three sections on the reverse of the Application Form attached to this brochure:
 » The top left hand side lists obligations and responsibilities. You need to sign and date the form to indicate acceptance of these.
 » The bottom left hand side provides some explanatory notes.
 » On the right hand side is a map grid for you to use to show where on the property the fire (s) is/are to be lit. Include as much detail as you can, indicating fire breaks, water, roads and tracks and where possible, details of structures on neighbouring properties. Attach a separate plan if you wish.
 Note: Insufficient detail or lack of a clear plan to manage the fire, may delay or even prevent the issue of a Permit to Light Fire.
